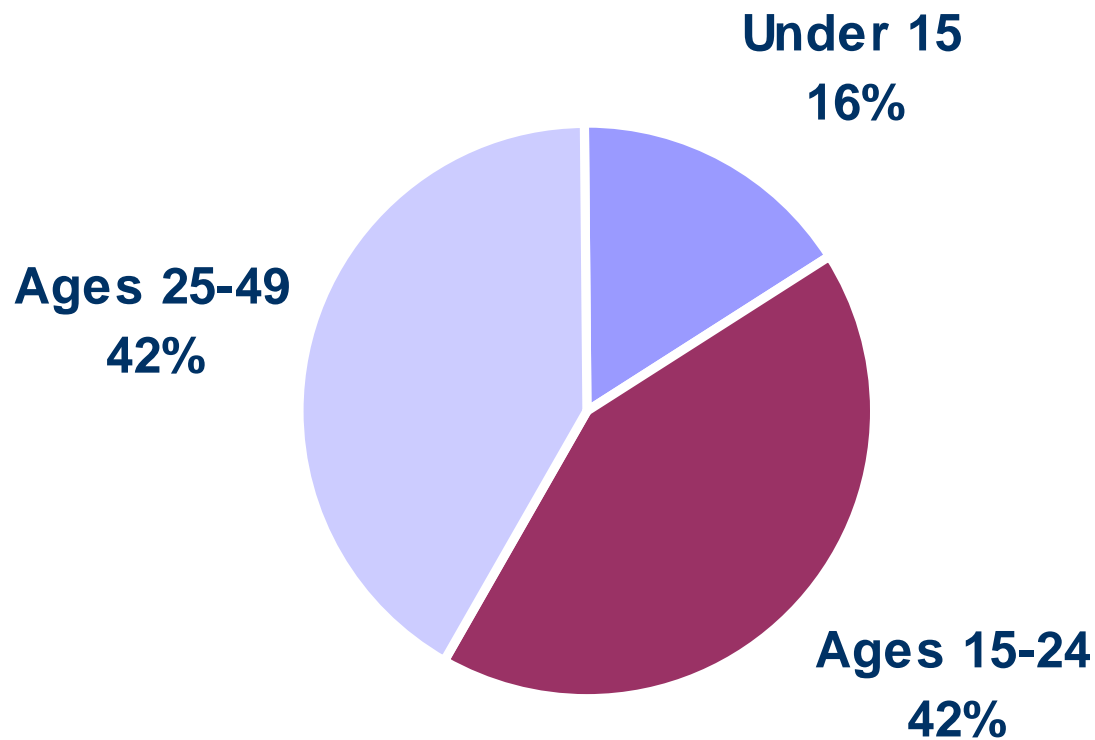

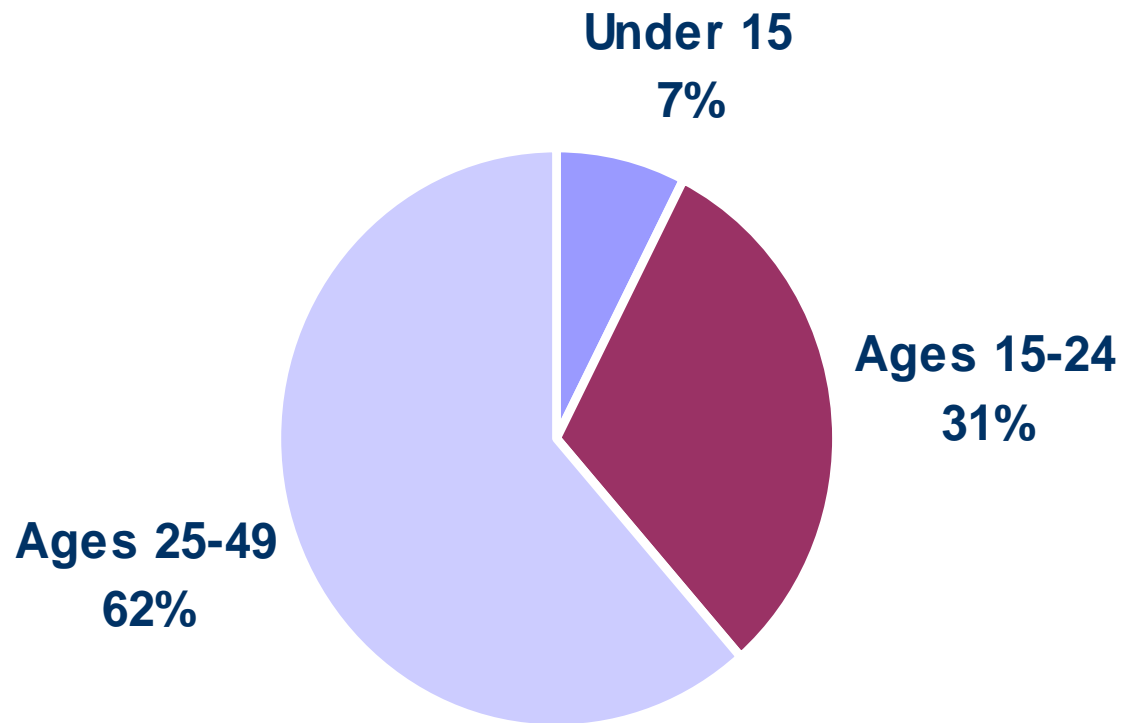
Over Half of New Infections Are Among Young People

Most Young People Living with HIV/AIDS are in Sub-Saharan Africa, and Most are Women

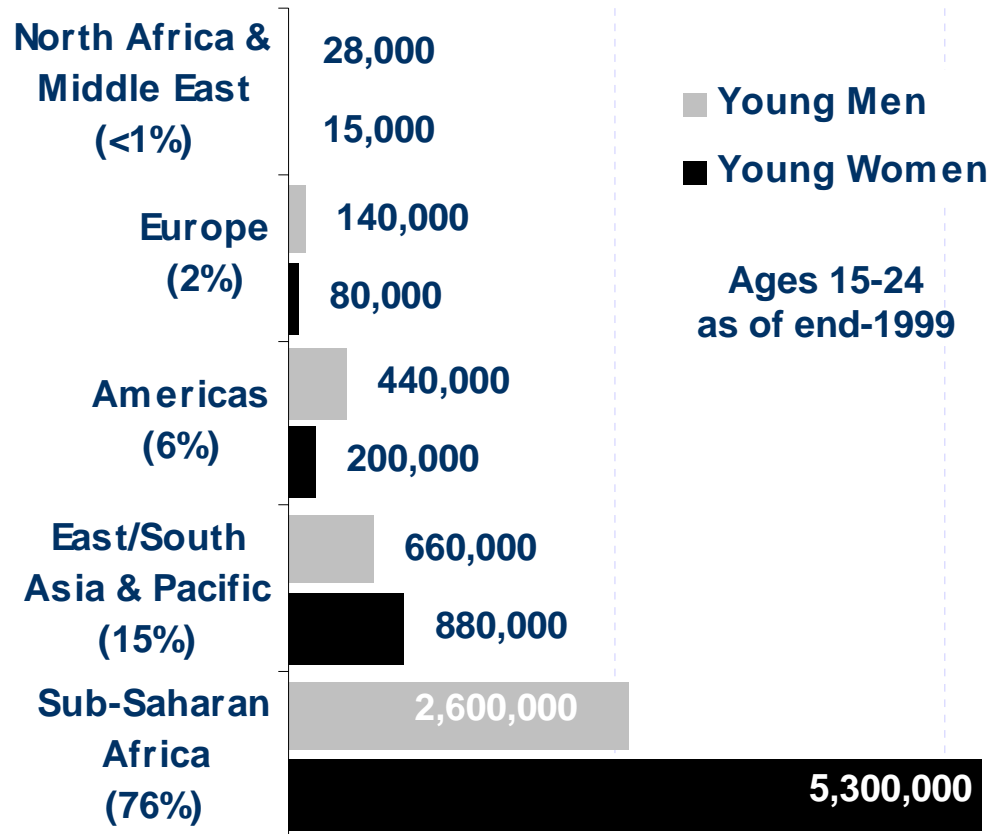

High Rates of HIV Infections Among Young People Occur in Countries with Young Populations

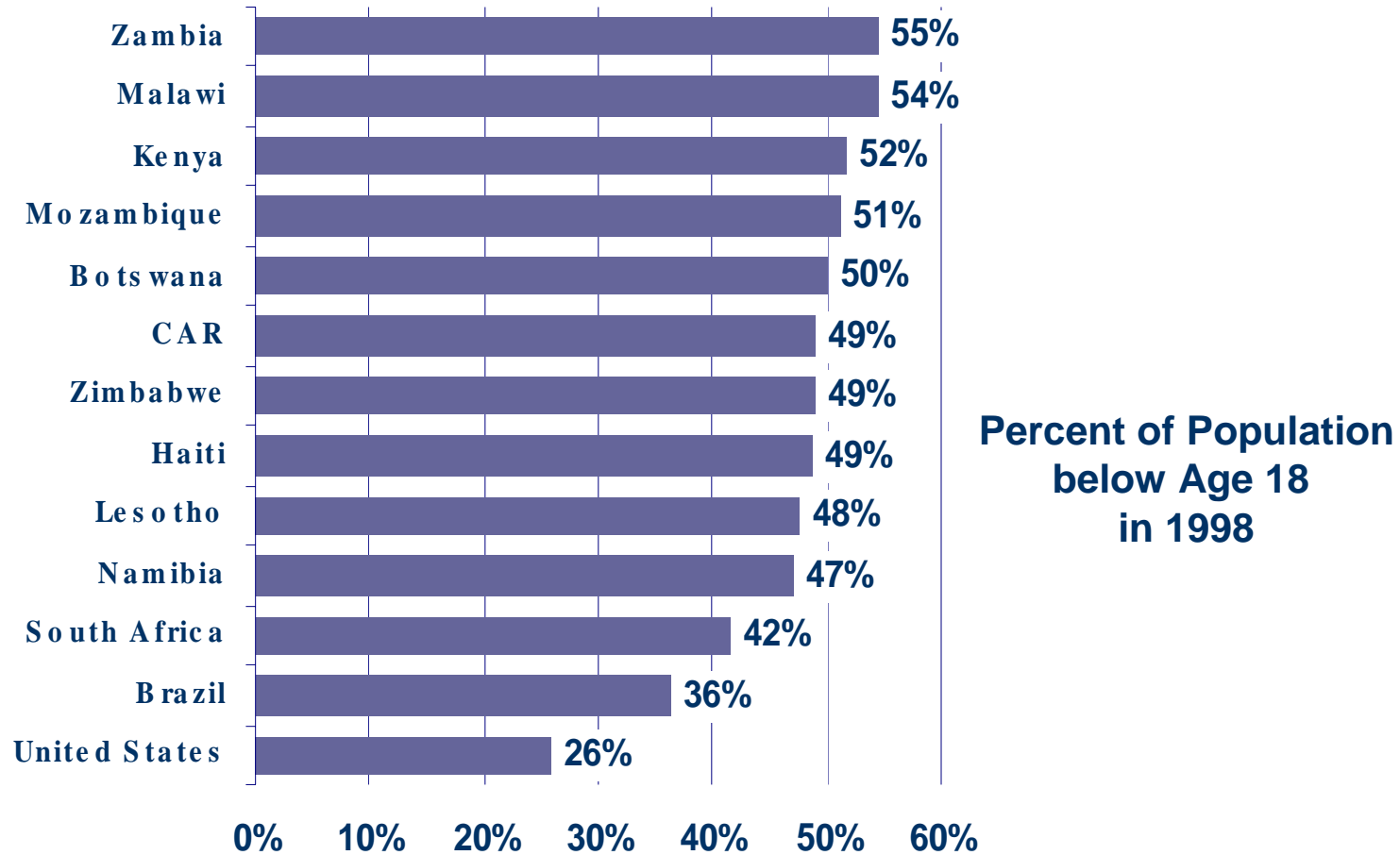

Projected Number of Young People, Ages 15-24, Living with HIV/AIDS Globally, 2001 through 2010

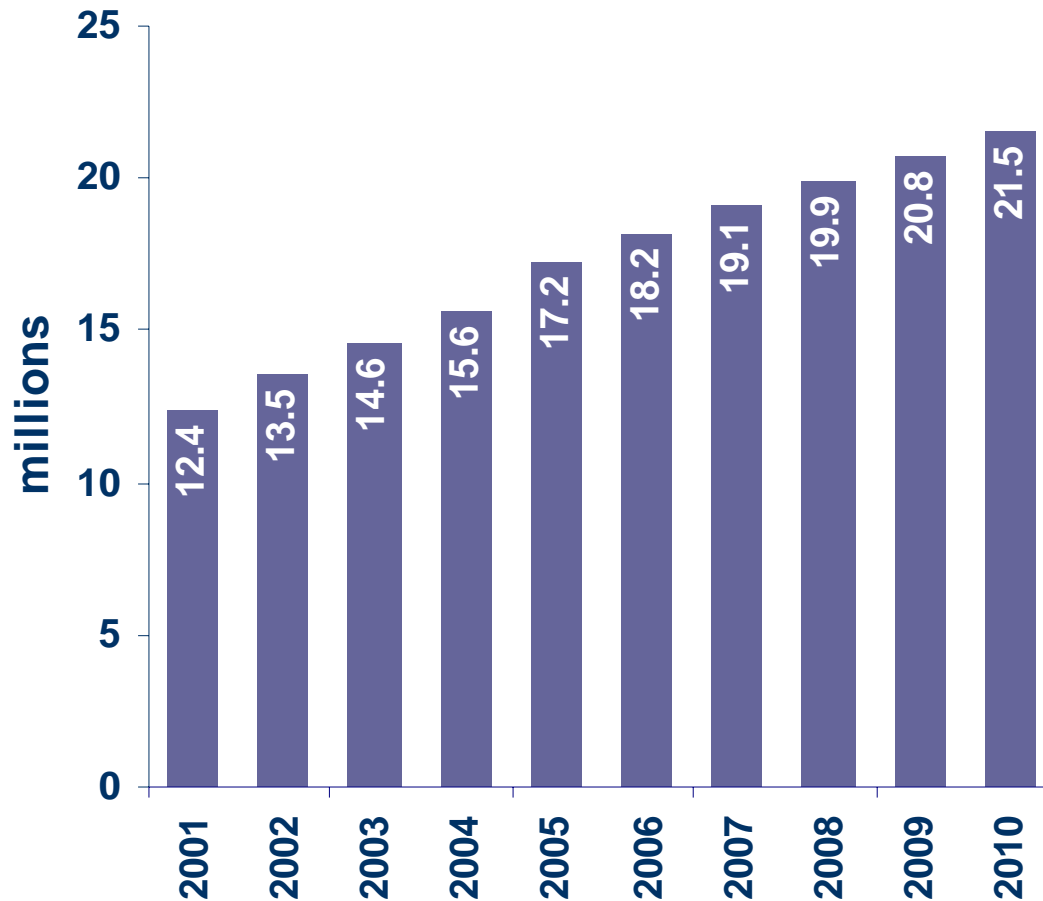
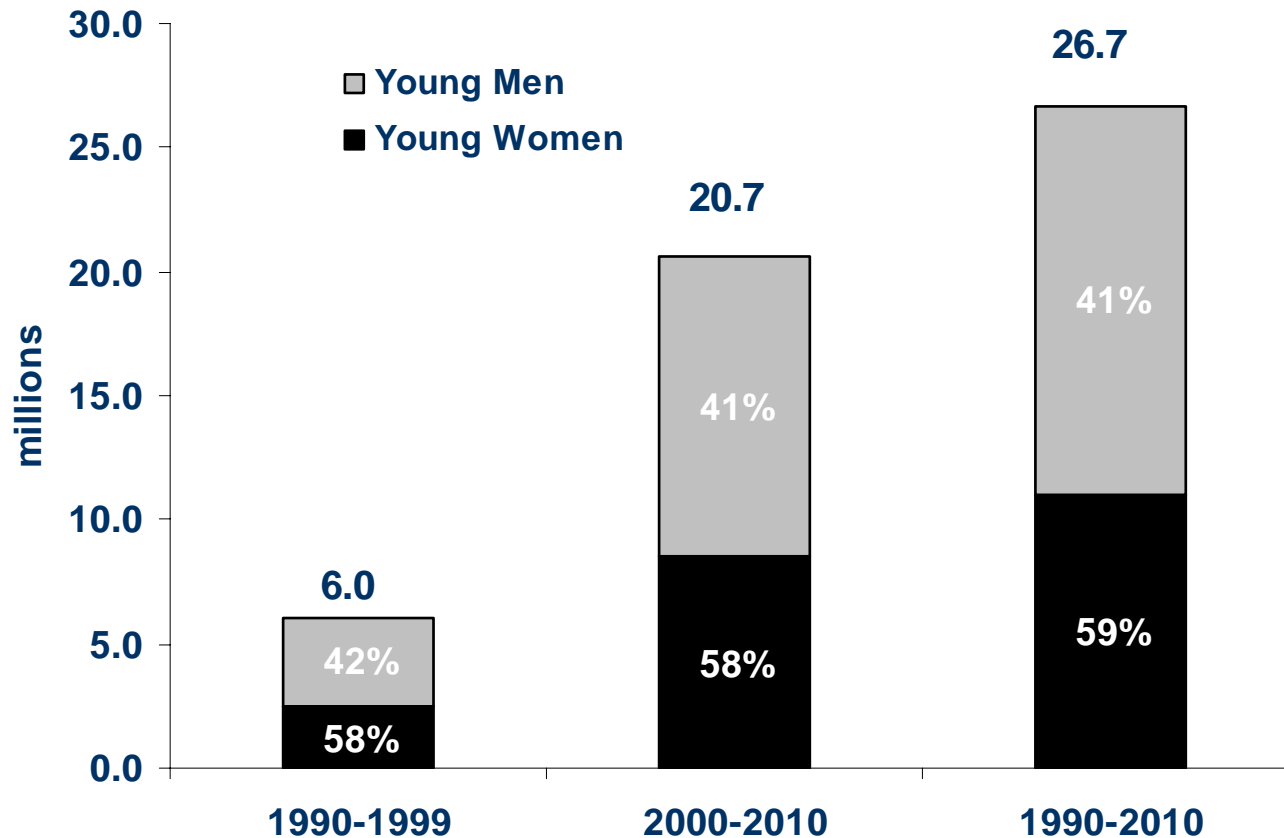
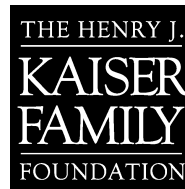
