

## POST-BANGKOK:

### Outcomes of the XV International AIDS Conference and board meeting of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB, and Malaria

WASHINGTON, July 19, 2004 —Senior HIV/AIDS experts will discuss the results of the Bangkok International AIDS Conference that concluded on July 16 as well as the board meeting of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB, and Malaria. The session, beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, July 21, 2004, at CSIS, 1800 K St. NW, Washington DC, B1- Conference center, room C, will feature **Kathleen Cravero**, deputy director, UNAIDS, **Bates Gill**, CSIS Freeman Chair in China Studies, **Todd Summers**, president, Progressive Health Partners, and **J. Stephen Morrison**, executive director, CSIS Task Force on HIV/AIDS.

The XV International AIDS Conference held in Bangkok, from July 11-16, highlighted the growing global commitment to halt the spread of HIV/AIDS. It also exposed the persistent tensions that exist among the multitude of players. At the July 21 session, panelists will summarize their impressions of the conference and identify the enduring challenges in mobilizing the global community and means to surmount these challenges.

The session is hosted by the CSIS Task Force on HIV/AIDS in collaboration with the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation. The CSIS Task Force on HIV/AIDS is cochaired by Senators Bill Frist (R-TN) and Russell Feingold (D-WI) and is funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Now in its second two-year phase, the Task force seeks to build bipartisan consensus on critical U.S. policy initiatives and promoting U.S. leadership in strengthening prevention, care, and treatment of HIV/AIDS in affected countries.
