

## **SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES**

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**PATRICIA NEUMAN** is a vice president of the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation and is the director of the Foundation's Medicare Policy Project. Her work for the Foundation focuses primarily on health policy issues related to Medicare, long-term care, and health coverage for low-income elderly and disabled populations. Dr. Neuman serves on the Department of Health and Human Services' Advisory Committee on Medicare Education and on the Century Foundation's Task Force on Medicare Reform. Before joining the Foundation in 1995, Dr. Neuman served for nine years on the professional staff of Congressional health committees. Dr. Neuman received a doctorate of science degree in health policy and management and a Masters of Science degree in health finance from the Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. She received her bachelor's degree from Wesleyan University.

**JULIAN PETTENGILL** is a research director for the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC). He has written about a wide range of payment policy topics, including MedPAC's payment policy framework, Medicare's payment policies for graduate medical education and teaching hospitals, refining the case-mix and input-price payment adjustments in Medicare's hospital inpatient prospective payment system (PPS), risk adjustment in the Medicare+Choice program, and economic conditions in rural health care markets. Prior to joining MedPAC in 1988 (then the Prospective Payment Assessment Commission – ProPAC), he was a senior policy analyst for the Congressional Research Service (1984 - 1988) and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (then the Health Care Financing Administration – HCFA, 1970 - 1984) where he developed and analyzed methods and policies for Medicare's hospital inpatient prospective payment system. His academic background includes economics (MA, Indiana University, 1970) and medical care organization (ABD University of Michigan, 1975).

**DIANE ROWLAND** is executive vice president of The Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation and executive director of The Kaiser Commission on Medicaid and the Uninsured. She is also an adjunct associate professor in the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health and a Brookdale senior fellow. Dr. Rowland serves on the Board of the Academy for Health Services Research and Health Policy, the Secretary's Task Force on Infant Mortality, and The Commonwealth Fund Task Force on Health Insurance for Working Americans. Her federal health policy experience includes the staff of the Subcommittee on Health and the Environment in the U.S. House of Representatives, as well as senior health policy positions in the Department of Health and Human Services in the Office of the Secretary and the Health Care Financing Administration. Dr. Rowland specializes in issues related to health insurance coverage, access to care, and health care financing for low-income, elderly, and disabled populations and has published widely on these subjects. Dr. Rowland holds a bachelor's degree from Wellesley College, a master's in public administration from the University of California-Los Angeles and a doctor of science degree in health policy and management from Johns Hopkins University.
