Global Fund Principles & Country Process

- Country led approach – support national programs
- Support proposals for funding which complement and coordinate with existing National and Regional Programs
- Build on existing coordination mechanisms and promote new and innovative partnerships
- Financing Mechanism - country driven partnerships is key to effective delivery of programs

Coordination – What is working

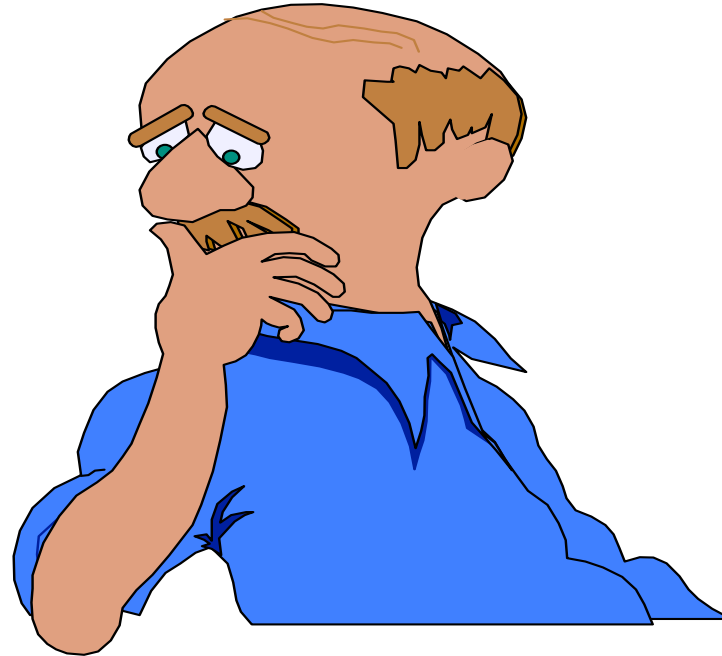
- Strong collaboration and coordination at the Global Level e.g. IHP and H8
- Joint development of systems and tools e.g. procurement & monitoring and evaluation
- Active participation in joint review missions
- Joint planning and development of work plans to operationalize MoUs and other agreements

Coordination Challenges

- Translating global coordination initiatives into actions particularly at country level
- Aid coordination leadership
- Defining and clarifying roles & responsibilities of partners
- Strengthening coordination within national structures
- Consistency and predictability of donor funding

Way forward

- Develop effective communication mechanism to monitor the implementation of global coordination initiatives
- Document and disseminate best practices to promote effective coordination
- Formalise the division of labor of the various partners-acknowledge comparative advantage of partners
- Provide resources (financial and non-financial) to strengthen national structures and systems
